WHAT INSPIRED you to get

into this field? Autistic children are not mentally retarded, and they are not mad. They are special children and they need special

attention. I am a journalist by profes-sion and wrote a lot about autism to bring about an awareness among the people. That was in the early seven-ties when I was working with Asia World, a magazine pub-lished from Kolkata.

My son who is twenty now, is an autistic child. I wanted

to help him.

Where did you get your train-

ing from? I did my training from the United States. Initially I start-ed to work with my son at home. Then in the course of time I realised that I could

help more kids like my son who need it. Thus, I started dealing with other kids. The centre, Action for Autism was opened seven years back and I started training teachers and parents to deal with these special children.

Is Autism curable? I would not like to give a pes-simistic answer. If not completely curable, proper training surely ensures a better. and an independent life.
